Everyone was **extremely** bored.

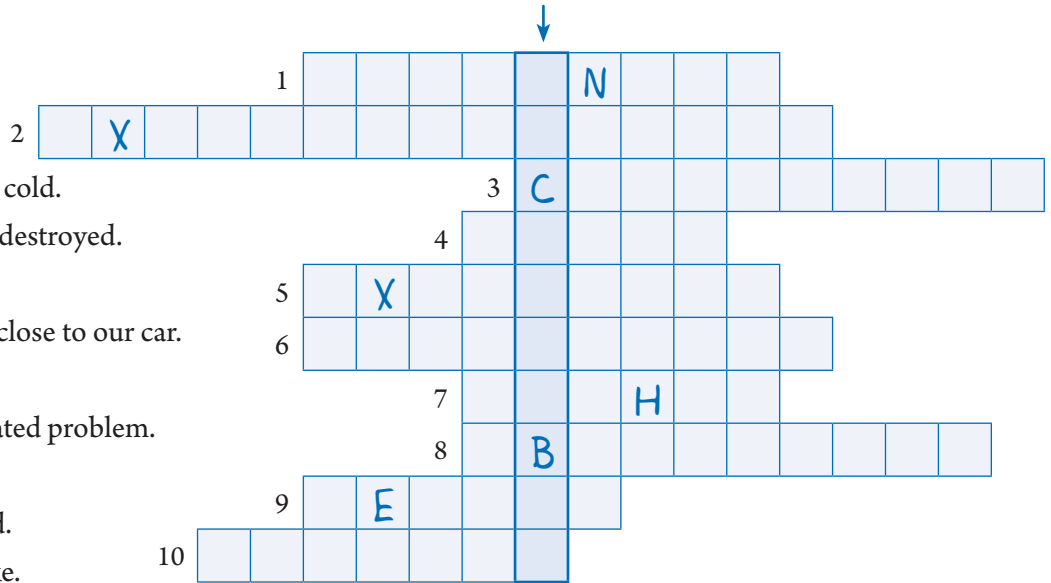
